Forum on FCNL Priorities - February 9th, 11:30am

The Friends Committee on National Legislation is a Quaker lobbying group that tries to promote issues of peace and justice in Washington, DC. They are non-partisan but uphold Quaker values. They seek to bring about a better world.

FCNL has asked San Antonio Quakers for our worship and discernment about FCNL's legislative priorities for the next Congress, which begins January 2021. This is a process carried out every two years to guide the work of the FCNL staff.

On February 9, we will have a forum after worship to discuss and discern our Meeting's priorities for federal legislation. We will share specific issues or concerns that can be addressed through the legislative process. For inspiration, these are FCNL's four guiding Policy Statements:

- We seek a world free of war and the threat of war.
- We seek a society with equity and justice for all.
- We seek a community where every person's potential may be fulfilled.
- We seek an earth restored.

Please come to the forum and help us think about these matters. If you cannot attend but would still like to contribute to the prioritization process, please write down your main policy concerns and hand them to Julia Hitz.

Quarterly Meeting on March 7th

Cielo Grande Quarterly Meeting will be held on Saturday, March 7th, at our Meetinghouse. Quarterly Meetings stand mid-way between Monthly Meetings (like FMSA) and Yearly Meetings – in our case South Central Yearly Meeting (SCYM: <u>www.scym.org</u>). Cielo Grande includes Friends from meetings in Dallas-Ft. Worth, Waco, Georgetown, Austin, San Antonio, Hill Country, and Coastal Bend. We usually meet every year, though it has been two years since our last gathering.

The Quarterly Meeting will begin with worship at 8:30 and offer a program on <u>Quakers Building Community</u>. As some Friends travel a distance to get here, FMSA hopes to offer hospitality to those who need it. There will be a simple meal and fellowship on Friday, the 6th. Some attendees may join FMSA for worship on the 8th.


Movie Night a Success!


Opening, Greeting, Closing
