#### Clerk's Corner: Moving to the "New Normal"

Over the last month, we have developed a "new normal" for Friends Meeting of San Antonio.

- 1. We have resumed in-person Meetings for Worship in the Meetinghouse. We have two Sunday Meetings for Worship: at **8:30am (in-person only)** and at **10am (in-person and on Zoom)**.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday Simple Meal & Special Event


Workshop on "Individual Spiritual Discernment" (6:00-8:30pm at the Meetinghouse)

#### Restarting our Children's Program: Step-by-Step:

Friends Meeting is committed to restarting the program for families with children. The first step was a forum 11/28 to explore our options. The age span seems to be 4 to 12 years old. This suggests two groups for parts of the program. For example, reading a story together then splitting for the reflection and activities.

It is important to devise activities that engage children at every age, but do not suggest any dogma. There is no shortage of appropriate materials, and we can explore the range of world religions and emphasize ethical values, as well as Quaker history and practices.

The Children's Program will take place during the 10:00 worship, hopefully starting Jan 2.

The key is recruiting Friends who do *NOT* have children in the program to volunteer one Sunday a month. This lets parents attend worship and gives them a needed break. We will need a minimum per day of two adults, one of whom may be a professional childcare person. We will need a third adult



when there are enough children to split into age groups. We will provide training for volunteers.

Gretchen Haynes has offered to act as initial coordinator to recruit and schedule volunteers. She will engage with parents in developing the curriculum.

## Wider Quaker World

#### AFSC Asks: "Do You Know What Your Investments Do?"

The Quaker-based American Friends Service Committee (AFSC) has identified 60+ major companies that profit from the militarization of the U.S. border and the surveillance and criminalization of immigrants. It urges Friends and others to divest from these companies in support of immigrant justice. The divestment list includes household names like Microsoft, Motorola, IBM, Salesforce, Google, and Amazon.

"These companies build border walls and so called 'smart' borders, hacking into our phones and tracking all our movements, hunting down immigrants and caging families," said Dov Baum, AFSC's director of economic activism. "Let's call on our city, college, faith organization, endowment, union, pension fund or bank to divest for immigrant justice, to cut our ties and withdraw from any partnership with these surveillance and security industries. It is time for us to divest from these harmful business activities, and invest in our communities instead."

AFSC is the first institution with a comprehensive immigrant justice investment policy; with a decision to divest from the prison-industrial complex as a whole, not just from private prison companies; and with a policy that addresses Israeli apartheid. The policy guides AFSC's approximately \$240 million investment portfolio.

AFSC's Investigate Database allows investors to scan their stock portfolios and mutual funds to see if they are invested in companies that are involved in state violence. The database lists over 200 company and industry profiles.

#### FCNL Messages and Opportunities:

#### Help end child poverty: support the extension of tax credits for children.

Unless the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and the Child Tax Credit (CTC) expansions are extended, these two highly effective anti-poverty programs will expire by Dec. 31. Extending these expanded programs in the Build Back Better Act could cut child poverty in half and lift 4.1 million children above the poverty line, including 1.2 million Black children and 1.7 million Latino children. If Congress fails to extend these credits, tens of millions of low-income parents would no longer receive the full CTC, and fewer families would qualify for the EITC. The consequences for our society's wellbeing would be immense. You



can use this information to compose letters, emails and phone calls to your senators and representative.
