"The Great problem facing modern man is that the means by which we live have outdistanced the spiritual ends for which we live."



We will explore our options together.

FMSA 2021 Budget

As repeatedly explained in this year's Treasurer's reports, contributions this unusual year have not come close to meeting our expenses. Even if December contributions come in at their average level, we will still be \$5000 short of the amount needed to balance our budget. As a result, the Finance Committee has proposed a somewhat slimmer budget than usual. This presumes that the COVID crisis will continue for the next several months.

In order to meet the reduced 2021 proposed spending, the Finance Committee will propose the following two Minutes at the JANUARY meeting. These minutes change previously minuted spending and budgeting practices for 2021 only.


- 1. Given the current lack of use of the RAICES Fund, the current addition to that fund of 50% of the Friends Fiduciary distribution, paid in June and December, will be added to Operating Cash in 2021. This change is for 2021 only. Continuing current practice, the remaining 50% will be deposited to General Maintenance.
- 2. Given the substantial balance in the Sinking Fund, addition to this Fund, which has been \$500 per month for some years, is suspended in 2021.

A Note from the Treasurer


The letter accompanying the quarterly statement for our accounts with Friends Fiduciary Corp. included information on the charitable donation of stocks. This is primarily of interest to older folks with appreciated stocks in their portfolio, who would rather not pay capital gains on their sale. The Friends Fiduciary Corporation will receive and liquidate stocks for free if they are donated to our account. The donor gets credit for the appreciated value as a charitable donation.

A nominal fee, \$25 for a single stock, slightly more for multiple, is charged when the proceeds are paid out, to, for example, FMSA. This donation avoids capital gains tax for the donor and avoids the need for FMSA to set up a brokerage account. 

September 2021 will mark 20 years of war justified by the 2001 post-9/11 Authorization of the Use of Military Force (AUMF) and the later 2002 Iraq AUMF. These pieces of legislation have allowed three different administrations to authorize over 40 military actions in 19 countries without congressional approval. This rampant war-making is an affront to the Quaker peace testimony and FCNL's vision for a world free of war and the threat of war. 2021 is the year to end endless wars once and for all.

As we lay the groundwork for 2021 in this season of peace, join FCNL advocates and Advocacy Team members in calling on Congress to repeal the 2002 Iraq AUMF within the first 100 days of Congress and support repeal of the 2001 AUMF. 
How is the current pandemic affecting you? How are you engaging in personal renewal and social transformation? What space are you creating for love and justice? How do you envision hope within the current time in history?
